OUR MISSION IS TO IMPROVE THE LIVES OF UNDER RESOURCED YOUTH BY INCREASING ACCESS AND OPPORTUNITIES TO SPORTS IN THEIR SCHOOLS To Our Incredible Fanbase,

It's been quite the year! When I transitioned into this role July 1, 2020, we were in the middle of civil unrest and a pandemic, both of which most of us have not experienced in our lifetime. Initially, I didn't know if and how we would make it through the school year, especially not knowing if or when school or school sports would return. KClay Vo, Evergreen High School student-athlete characterized the school year well saying, "I use sports as my getaway from stress. I haven't been able to do that because of the pandemic." So many student-athletes can relate.

One of our goals coming into this new role during a time of unrest and uncertainty was this – make it count! To make it count, we added 5 new board members from the community and a communications intern, Jackelin Jimenez through University of Washington's UCBI (Undergraduate Community-based Internship) Program. To make it count, we strengthened existing partnerships and cultivated new ones to execute programs. To make it count, we pivoted from our in-person girls leadership camp and held a virtual girls leadership summit on National Women & Girls in Sports Day. To make it count, we pivoted from our fall 2020 "Aces" middle school tennis program so we could conduct an inperson program in the spring of 2021. To make it count, we launched a new scholarship program called, "Just Athlete," recognizing student-athletes who aren't "just" athletes but are young people participating in creating a "just" society. Lastly, along with other non-profits, we conducted a virtual fundraising event. The final count: we resourced 33 schools, impacted 1,087 studentathletes, distributed 1,798 items, and offered 31 days of programming.

As I reflect on what has been a very turbulent school year, I am grateful. Grateful for our amazing team and board, and grateful for each of you. We undoubtedly could not have made the year count without being able to count on you. So on behalf of the entire Sports In Schools team, THANK YOU for making it count this year!

As we all start to emerge on the other side of this pandemic that has sidelined student-athletes, we anticipate school sports to make a comeback. We want to make sure we are there to support them and we hope we can continue to count on your support!




